All new students are required to show proficiency in Music History & Literature and Music Theory. The proficiencies may be satisfied in any of the following ways:		Applied Lessons Y9??		16 credits Historical Performance Graduate Major (3-8 credits per enrollment)		
Students may take and pass the graduate entrance exams. Students must take the exams at the beginning of their first semester of enrollment; they may take them for a second time in their second semester. They may not take them again, nor may they take them after their second semester of enrollment. (Note that this includes summer sessions in which students are enrolled. Exams are ordinarily given in the week before classes begin each semester.) Students may enroll in and pass the graduate review courses listed below: <b>M501 Proseminar in Music History (3 cr)</b> <b>T508 Written Theory Review for Graduate Students (3 cr)</b> <b>T509 Sight Singing Review for Graduate Students (1 cr)</b> <b>T511 Aural Theory Review for Graduate Students (1 cr)</b> Students should begin enrolling in review courses from which they are not exempted by examination as soon as possible; otherwise completion of the degree may be delayed as T508 and M501 serve as prerequisites to the master's music history and literature requirement. <i>The review courses are not offered every semester</i> . <b>Keyboard Proficiency Examination</b> All music graduate students must pass a keyboard proficiency examination. This exam is designed to ensure the student's ability to use the keyboard as a tool within the framework of professional activities, and the requirements vary according to level and area of music study. This exam may be repeated as many times as necessary to show proficiency. The exam is offered at the end of each term. Students may enroll in secondary piano lessons as preparation for the exam. Historical Performance majors may take the exam on harpsichord. For details, see the Chairperson of the Historical Performance Department. This requirement must be completed before a student may begin qualifying examinations. Credits may be used for courses meeting Tool Subject requirements if the courses are at the 500 level or higher. Credits are taken in a single field outside the student's department, a formal minor must be declared. This requires the approval of the offering department. A maximum of 9 credits may be taken in a single department unless a minor is declared.
